We wanted to congratulate all our year 10 geographers for working so hard this academic year. We have been so impressed by their work ethic and also the enthusiasm and wider geographical knowledge they bring to the classroom. We also recently enjoyed a fieldtrip to Stratford where the students successfully investigated how and why the quality of life varied between East Village and Carpenters Estate. This helped them understand the redevelopment of an area of London and also how to apply their fieldwork enquiry skills which will be examined in the 'Geographical Investigations' section of the course. We are looking forward to the Isle of Sheppey trip where we will investigate whether the coastal management is suitable to protect the coastline at 2 locations.

Upcoming year 10 exams

During the class lesson on the week beginning Monday 20th June your child will have **2 examinations** in their geography lessons. One exam will be based on a **Paper 1 topic: Hazardous Earth (30 marks)**

- Climate Change
- Tropical Storms
- Earthquakes and Tsunamis (including named case study)
- Volcanoes

The second exam will be based on recently covered **Paper 2 content: UK Evolving Human Landscape and Geographical Investigations (fieldwork) (48 marks)**

- How and why working patterns have changed
- Impact of globalisation on UK
- London and poverty in different areas
- Changing zones and functions of a city
- Accessible rural areas of a city
- Migration into and within the UK

What are we studying next?

UKs Evolving Physical Landscape The topic looks at the following key enquiry questions:

- Why does the physical landscape of the UK vary from place to place?
- Why is there a variety of distinctive coastal landscapes and what are the processes that shape them?
- What are the challenges for coastal landscapes and communities and why is there conflict on how to manage them?

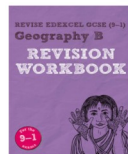
The school has a subscription which can be accessed via the School website. They need to create a login.
