
Welcome to the twelfth issue of the HayesCreates Newsletter - celebrating all the enrichment performing arts activities and events that take place at Hayes School.






#### HOUSE DRAMA 2024

The Music Department's Summer Concert took place on Wednesday July 3rd and provided the perfect conclusion to a year in which participation in enrichment music has reached record levels.


