

MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Over the last few weeks we have welcomed students, parents and carers into school for our Year 11 Information Evening, Year 13 Parent Forum and tutor evenings in Year 7 and 12. It was especially pleasing to hear how well our new students have settled into the school and how successfully they have made the transition into secondary school and Hayes Sixth Form. The feedback we received from you on the school and the valuable information you shared as parents/carers will help us to work in partnership to best support your child this year.

Having met with groups of Year 7 students for Year 7 Birthday Break, they have shared with me their readiness for secondary school, as well as their enjoyment of studying new subjects and working with many teachers. They seem to be especially enjoying school dinners and the choices on offer to them within the restaurant and from the pod.

Our enrichment programme is now well underway and as highlighted in this week's newsletter. We strongly students to get involved since we see the benefits participation brings to all who participate. Next week, we look forward to launching the Bronze and Silver DofE Award programme to Years 9, 10 and 12 and to hearing about our young people's ideas for volunteering in the local community, as well as the skills and physical activity they plan to undertake as part of the Award.

Our Senior Leadership Teams from across the Trust secondary schools came together this week to collaborate on a range of issues and we held the first meeting of the year as a local governing body, during which we reflected on an analysis of this summer's examination results and the school's development plan priorities for 2023-24.

This week's languages week celebrated languages and a particular highlight was the MFL Bake Off with students baking and decorating internationally inspired cakes to win valuable points for their house. Teachers and other staff demonstrated their linguistic talents in a range of languages to earn raffle tickets from students and to share their own enthusiasm for languages. As a languages teacher, together with my colleagues, I have seen first-hand the opportunities and experiences a foreign language offers to those who can speak it (or more importantly, those who are willing to give it a try). We are proud of the languages offer available to students at Hayes and recognise the importance of studying at least one language, notwithstanding the inevitable challenges many learners experience mastering the pronunciation, grammar and vocabulary in another language.

REMINDER – Arrangements for Friday 6th October and Monday 9th October



Ian Murphy (born 9th March 1963) is a contemporary British Fine Artist who gained initial success with selection to the British Young Contemporary Artists in 1985. He is best known for his powerful, tonal drawings and atmospheric, mixed media oil paintings of architectural places.



All of Ian Murphy's workshops are intended to be fast paced, exciting and most certainly, challenging for the students. He often says that the success of the workshop is not just measured by the achievements on the day, but how the techniques and visual stimuli in the sketchbooks and the artwork inspire everyone going forward.

Ian always aims to create the best creative environment possible for art students to work in. 


Student Leaders' Visit to the Houses of Parliament and Department for Education



Last week, we were given the opportunity to visit the Houses of Parliament and the government's Department for Education. We were fortunate to be offered the tour last year when we met with a group of senior members from the DfE, during their visit to Hayes School. At the Houses of Parliament building, we were taught even more about where and how the politics that shape our society are made.

The tour also showed the history of our government and a full picture of our modern, often controversial, politics today. Later that morning, our tour expanded to the DfE. We were greeted by a representative of the department who led us to a conference room and explained the tasks planned for the day. First, we joined a Teams call with a Civil Servant, who detailed the various roles they perform to achieve legislation set out by the government and the qualifications required to become a Civil Servant, which was interesting. We also took part in a quiz about what we had learned and were split into groups to discuss and debate the challenges currently faced in attracting more people into the teaching profession and, most importantly, retaining them. We then presented our ideas to two government ministers. Although this was nerve racking, once we'd started presenting, we found it really enjoyable, as they were eager to hear our thoughts and the viewpoint of current students. We had a fantastic experience in Westminster seeing where the policies that influence the school life of Hayes learners and students across the UK are pioneered and are extremely grateful to the team that supported us.

GIRLS IN AVIATION DAY – TRIP TO BOMBARDIER, BIGGIN HILL

On Wednesday 27th September, ten girls, from Year 10 upwards, were invited to attend a Girls in Aviation Careers Event at the prestigious aviation company Bombardier. The event was arranged for students to gain a greater insight into different roles available in the aviation profession and to learn about these from colleagues who work in this industry.

After initial talks from various personnel on their job roles, students were given the opportunity to participate in a series of activities. These included making a model airplane and being given certain words they had to identify where they were on their models. Another was learning about different areas where problems may incur in a jet and how to use different tools to fix damaged components.

However, the highlight for all students was having a tour inside a private jet aircraft, costing over

£100,000, and sitting in the cock pit – a unique experience!

This was a wonderful chance for students to find out more about career opportunities available in this fast growing and expanding environment.
